

- The mechanical installation of the conveyor system for a third party customer at the new distribution center for a women's apparel boutique in British Columbia has been completed. Wecon coordinated all phases of the mechanical and electrical installation for the project.
- The installation of the picking and distribution system for a warehousing and distributing center in Calgary is in its final phases and drawing to a close.
