### On Going and Completed Projects

- This past fall, our installers completed the installation of a material handling system for a phone distribution facility in Mississauga. The customer realizing the benefits and cost savings associated with the original scope of work generated a subsequent order consisting of an additional lane of equipment providing greater flexibility and extra material handling capacity. Now that's customer satisfaction.
- A Pallet Handling Transfer System was engineered, supplied and installed at a military facility east of Toronto. The system is designed to carry 10,000 lb pallets in preparation for loading aircraft.
- Our installation crews had a busy Christmas season with the installation of a structural support platform (18 ft wide x 550 ft long) at a juice bottling and packaging facility within the city of Toronto. In addition, we have been contracted to install a 3 tiered conveyor system consisting of used equipment supplied by the customer in support of their requirements. 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
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## On Going and Completed Projects—continued

## New Products

Wecon most recently developed and supplied a Pallet Handling Transfer System incorporating a weigh scale with integrated load cells. The system was developed based on the customer's requirement to convey 10,000 lb loaded pallets amassed within a cargo bay in queue for loading aircraft. The design incorporates a series of ball transfer conveyors with rows of heavy duty (drop-in) ball transfers units positioned to correspond to the location of the stringers or bottom deck boards of a pallet. Product is conveyed along the system by personnel pushing the load along the conveyor. The conveyor deck has been designed with a series of checker plates with non-skid surfaces. This provides a textured irregular surface for personnel to walk upon while moving the product. The conveyors are installed on a series of structural steel foundations that hold the system in place and level.
